Essential Functions

General Youth Pastor Functions

- Builds on the vision and mission of Clinton Frame: To help make and launch youth through discipleship, mentoring, and relationship investment.
- Provides visionary pastoral leadership for the Youth Ministry Teams and Sunday School Teachers.
- Recruits and trains volunteers to work with both Middle school and High school youth.
- Plans and implements activities, events, and teachings of the High School and Middle School youth during Wednesday evening youth group, as well as Sunday morning during the Sunday school hour.
- Is up-to-date with resources that the church has to offer that can help with both adolescent and family counseling. Has the heart of a shepherd that desires transformation in the lives of people.

General Pastoral Functions:

• Attends weekly staff meetings and worship meetings for purposes of planning and staying in touch with what is going on in other areas of the church.

- Provides leadership for Sunday morning worship (when available) through welcoming, announcements, offering, and serving on the ministry team.
- Performs various other duties as needed by the Lead Pastor to support current or potential ministries of Clinton Frame.
- Participates in the life of the community including Sunday mornings, Wednesday evenings, and other ministry specific events held at the church where a pastoral presence is expected.

Competencies

- Spiritual Maturity: Is genuine and trustworthy and nurture his/her spiritual life through Biblical reading, prayer, and mentoring relationships. Displays a high degree of self-awareness. Is able to articulate a clear, consistent Anabaptist theology centered on Christ.
